Challenge: If left unaddressed, nurse shortages will have severe and damaging impacts upon the availability and quality of health care services in the United States.

Addressing the Challenge: With its \$1,421,639 grant, the New Americans in Nursing Program will address the challenges by retraining unemployed or underemployed foreign-educated physicians to become registered nurses.

Projected Outcomes:

- An accelerated five semester Bachelors of Science in Nursing program for foreign educated physicians who meet prerequisites through previous training;
- 100 nursing students with prior clinical knowledge and experience will graduate during the grant period.
