
We're Preparing. Are Yo

Pandemic Flu Preparedness Essentials

The following items should be part of your disaster supplies, enough to last at least a week:

- Nonperishable food and water
- ☐ Medicines you take regularly
- ☐ Medicines for flu symptoms, including acetaminophen, ibuprofen, cough syrup
- □ Thermometer

- □ Personal hygiene items, including soap, tissues, toilet paper
- □ Alcohol-based hand cleaner
- □ Extra cash
- □ Large trash bags

What was the impact of reducing the King County Council from 13 members to 9?

The new 7th District more than doubled in size to 124 square miles. Councilmember Pete von Reichbauer now represents 60,000 more constituents including the City of Auburn as well as a 50 square mile region of unincorporated King County that stretches to the borders of Enumclaw, Black Diamond, Covington, and Maple Valley.

28% of the new 7th District is unincorporated and Pete is their only locally elected representative. His office may be in Seattle, but his roots are in South King County. He spends much of his time traveling I-5, Hwy 167, Hwy 18 and all the roads in between. Last year Pete logged more miles than any other Councilmember!




Pete von Reichbauer joins students in releasing salmon smolts for their journey to the Pacific.
