MEMORANDUM TO ALL PARTICIPANTS -- SEVENTH CONFERENCE ON SCIENCE AND WORLD AFFAIRS

Certain difficulties have arisen in connection with the sites originally selected for the Conference -- Woods Hole, Massachusetts and Aspen, Colorado. It has been decided, therefore, to hold the meetings in a single location and The Lodge at Smugglers Notch in Stowe, Vermont has been selected. All other conference plans are unchanged: the period from September 5 through September 8 will be devoted to discussion of international cooperation in science, and the period from September 10 through September 17 will be spent on the subject of disarmament and arms control.

Stowe is located in northern Vermont at the base of Mount Mansfield. It is 36 miles from Burlington, 22 miles from Montpelier. From New York, Eastern Airlines flies to Burlington. From Boston, Northeast Airlines flies to Montpelier and Burlington.

The normal average temperature range at Stowe during the Conference period is 50 - 75 degrees Fahrenheit. The facilities at the Lodge include an outdoor heated swimming pool, tennis courts, horseback riding stables, and golf course. In addition, on Mount Mansfield many hiking trails are available from the top of the chairlift. Bring the necessary clothes and equipment if you are interested in any of these leisure activities.
