- Increased understanding of FNS policies, priorities and future initiatives pertaining to FSNE and increased submission of State Nutrition Education Plans that comply with FNS FSNE Guidance.
- o Identification of new skills, methods, and resources to increase healthy eating and active lifestyles among FS participants in order to promote health and reduce risks of diet related diseases through nutrition education
- o Increased FSNE quality, consistency, and capacity to deliver outcome based nutrition education
- o Enhanced communication that supports trust based on understanding local, state, regional, national communication within and across projects, institutions, organizations, and agencies
