## Targeting Food Stamp Audiences Outside the School Setting Discussion Session – 17 March 2004 Facilitator: Beverly Howell, Ph.D., C.F.C.S. State Program Leader, Family and Consumer Sciences Mississippi State University Extension Service

Groups were established to review a three-question handout and to provide insight into reaching the Food Stamp audience outside the school setting. Each individual group was given an opportunity to respond to the questions – the design was to answer each question, but in reality each group gave a summative answer of all questions. Following is a breakdown of questions and responses.

## Question 1: What did you hear at this conference on targeting food stamp audiences outside the school setting?

- o Target should be to only Food Stamp participants and applicants.
- o Increase direct contacts
- o Depends on interpretation of food stamp audience
- o How do you identify Food Stamp recipients without asking

## Question 2: What innovative strategies and approaches, with the criteria FNS has set, can be used for targeting food stamp audiences outside the school setting?

- o Develop close, working relationship with state and local Food Stamp offices
- o Place literature racks with FSNE materials in Food Stamp offices
- Ask to attend State Food Stamp Directors' conference and present synopsis of FSNE program
- o Work with Head Start parents
- o Post notices of upcoming FSNE meetings at Food Stamp offices
- o Place posters with nutrition education messages in strategic locations that clientele frequent
- o Include message with EBT card issuance about different FSNE classes being offered
- Work with Housing Authority
- o Seek participants at Homeless Shelters
- o Develop better relationships with Food Stamp partners
- o Provide incentives
- o Go where participants are (i.e. faith-based community, local beauty/barber salons, GED classes, Welfare to Work, Office on Aging, etc.)
- o Invite state Food Stamp personnel to FSNE statewide training
- o Promote meetings through indirect contacts (i.e. newsletters, media, etc.)

## Question 3: How can states/institutions work cooperatively to target food stamp audiences outside the school setting?

- o Work with audience to eliminate stigma attached to receiving Food Stamps
- o Place referral packets at Food Stamp office
