

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 2586, AS REPORTED
OFFERED BY MR. STUMP OF ARIZONA OR MR.
SKELTON OF MISSOURI**

At the end of division A (page 348, after line 8), insert the following new title:

**TITLE XV—ACTIVITIES TO
COMBAT TERRORISM
Subtitle A—Increased Funding to
Combat Terrorism**

SEC. 1501. INCREASED FUNDING.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The amount provided in section 301(5) for Operation and Maintenance, Defense-wide Activities, is hereby increased by \$400,000,000, to be available as follows:

(1) INTELLIGENCE PROGRAMS.—For increased situational awareness and upgrades to intelligence programs to enhance United States security posture, \$100,000,000.

(2) ANTI-TERRORISM INITIATIVES.—For enhanced anti-terrorism and force protection initiatives to reduce vulnerabilities at United States military installations and facilities in the United States and worldwide, \$150,000,000.



1 (3) COUNTER-TERRORISM INITIATIVES.—For
2 offensive counter-terrorism initiatives, \$100,000,000.

3 (4) CONSEQUENCE MANAGEMENT ACTIVI-
4 TIES.—For consequence management activities,
5 \$50,000,000.

6 (b) TRANSFER AUTHORITY.—The amounts specified
7 in subsection (a) are available for transfer to other current
8 accounts of the Department of Defense, as determined by
9 the Secretary of Defense.

10 (c) OFFSETTING REDUCTIONS.—

11 (1) The amount provided in section 201(4) for
12 Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, De-
13 fense-Wide is hereby reduced by \$265,000,000, to be
14 derived from amounts for the Ballistic Missile De-
15 fense Organization, of which—

16 (A) \$145,000,000 shall be derived from
17 the Mid-Course Defense Segment program ele-
18 ment (PE603882C); and

19 (B) \$120,000,000 shall be derived from
20 the Boost Phase Defense Segment program ele-
21 ment (PE603883C) for space-based activities.

22 (2) The amount provided in section 301(5) for
23 Operation and Maintenance, Defense-wide Activities,
24 is hereby reduced by \$135,000,000, to be derived
25 from amounts for consulting services.



1 **SEC. 1502. TREATMENT OF TRANSFERRED AMOUNTS.**

2 Funds transferred under authority of section 1501(a)
3 shall be merged with, and shall be available for the same
4 time period as, the appropriations to which transferred.
5 The transfer authority under that section is in addition
6 to the transfer authority provided by section 1001.

7 **Subtitle B—Policy Matters Relating**
8 **to Combating Terrorism**

9 **SEC. 1511. ASSESSMENT OF DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE**
10 **ABILITY TO RESPOND TO TERRORIST AT-**
11 **TACKS.**

12 (a) **ASSESSMENT.**—The Secretary of Defense shall
13 conduct an assessment of the ability of the Department
14 of Defense to provide support for the consequence man-
15 agement activities of other Federal, State, and local agen-
16 cies, directly taking into account the terrorist attacks on
17 the United States on September 11, 2001, and the
18 changed situation regarding terrorism.

19 (b) **RECOMMENDATIONS.**—The Secretary of Defense
20 shall submit to the President and Congress a report pro-
21 viding recommendations for ways to enhance the ability
22 of the Department of Defense to provide support described
23 in subsection (a). The report shall address the rec-
24 ommendations made by the Vice President in his report
25 to the President on the development of a coordinated na-
26 tional effort to improve national preparedness, including



1 efforts to combat terrorism, as directed by the President
2 in May 2001. The report shall be submitted not later than
3 60 days after the date on which the Vice President sub-
4 mits to the President the report under the preceding sen-
5 tence.

6 **SEC. 1512. REPORT ON DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE ABILITY**
7 **TO PROTECT THE UNITED STATES FROM AIR-**
8 **BORNE THREATS.**

9 Not later than 120 days after the date of the enact-
10 ment of this Act, the Secretary of Defense shall submit
11 to Congress a report on the ability of the Department of
12 Defense to protect the United States from airborne
13 threats, including threats originating from within the bor-
14 ders of the United States. The report shall identify im-
15 provements that can be made to enhance the security of
16 the American people against these threats and shall rec-
17 ommend actions, including legislative proposals, designed
18 to address and overcome existing vulnerabilities.

19 **SEC. 1513. ESTABLISHMENT OF COMBATING TERRORISM AS**
20 **A NATIONAL SECURITY MISSION.**

21 Section 108(b)(2) of the National Security Act of
22 1947 (50 U.S.C. 404a(b)(2)) is amended by inserting “,
23 including acts of terrorism,” after “aggression”.



1 **SEC. 1514. DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE COORDINATION**
2 **WITH FEMA AND FBI.**

3 The Secretary of Defense shall seek an agreement
4 with the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation
5 and the Director of Federal Emergency Management
6 Agency that clarifies the roles of Department of Defense
7 Weapons of Mass Destruction Civil Support Teams in re-
8 lation to both agencies with respect to coordination of the
9 roles and missions of those teams in support of crisis man-
10 agement and consequence management efforts.
