11	(3) Of such treaties, nearly half were enacted

13	(4) Treaties enacted prior to the 1970's are ba-

15	in the treaties are extraditable offenses.
16	(5) Treaties negotiated since the 1970's are
17	much more effective because they are flexible and re-
