

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 1646, AS REPORTED  
OFFERED BY MR. MENENDEZ OF NEW JERSEY**

Page 153, after line 23, add the following:

1 **TITLE IX—IRAN NUCLEAR PRO-**  
2 **LIFERATION PREVENTION**  
3 **ACT OF 2001**

4 **SEC. 901. SHORT TITLE.**

5 This title may be cited as the “Iran Nuclear Pro-  
6 liferation Prevention Act of 2001”.

7 **SEC. 902. WITHHOLDING OF VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS**  
8 **TO THE INTERNATIONAL ATOMIC ENERGY**  
9 **AGENCY FOR PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS IN**  
10 **IRAN.**

11 Section 307 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961  
12 (22 U.S.C. 2227) is amended by adding at the end the  
13 following:

14 “(d) Notwithstanding subsection (c), the limitations  
15 of subsection (a) shall apply to programs and projects of  
16 the International Atomic Energy Agency in Iran, unless  
17 the Secretary of State makes a determination in writing  
18 to the Committee on International Relations of the House  
19 of Representatives and the Committee on Foreign Rela-  
20 tions of the Senate that such programs and projects are  
21 consistent with United States nuclear nonproliferation and



1 safety goals, will not provide Iran with training or exper-  
2 tise relevant to the development of nuclear weapons, and  
3 are not being used as a cover for the acquisition of sen-  
4 sitive nuclear technology. A determination made by the  
5 Secretary of State under the preceding sentence shall be  
6 effective for the 1-year period beginning on the date of  
7 the determination.”.

8 **SEC. 903. ANNUAL REVIEW BY SECRETARY OF STATE OF**  
9 **PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS OF THE INTER-**  
10 **NATIONAL ATOMIC ENERGY AGENCY; UNITED**  
11 **STATES OPPOSITION TO PROGRAMS AND**  
12 **PROJECTS OF THE AGENCY IN IRAN.**

13 (a) ANNUAL REVIEW.—

14 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of State shall  
15 undertake a comprehensive annual review of all pro-  
16 grams and projects of the International Atomic En-  
17 ergy Agency in the countries described in section  
18 307(a) of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22  
19 U.S.C. 2227(a)) and shall determine if such pro-  
20 grams and projects are consistent with United  
21 States nuclear nonproliferation and safety goals.

22 (2) REPORT.—Not later than 1 year after the  
23 date of the enactment of this Act and on an annual  
24 basis thereafter for 5 years, the Secretary shall pre-



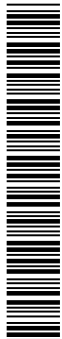
1       pare and submit to the Congress a report containing  
2       the results of the review under paragraph (1).

3       (b) OPPOSITION TO CERTAIN PROGRAMS AND  
4 PROJECTS OF INTERNATIONAL ATOMIC ENERGY AGEN-  
5 CY.—The Secretary of State shall direct the United States  
6 representative to the International Atomic Energy Agency  
7 to oppose programs of the Agency that are determined by  
8 the Secretary under the review conducted under sub-  
9 section (a)(1) to be inconsistent with nuclear nonprolifera-  
10 tion and safety goals of the United States.

11 **SEC. 904. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.**

12       (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the  
13 date of the enactment of this Act and on an annual basis  
14 thereafter for 5 years, the Secretary of State, in consulta-  
15 tion with the United States representative to the Inter-  
16 national Atomic Energy Agency, shall prepare and submit  
17 to the Congress a report that—

18           (1) describes the total amount of annual assist-  
19       ance to Iran from the International Atomic Energy  
20       Agency, a list of Iranian officials in leadership posi-  
21       tions at the Agency, the expected timeframe for the  
22       completion of the nuclear power reactors at the  
23       Bushehr nuclear power plant, and a summary of the  
24       nuclear materials and technology transferred to Iran  
25       from the Agency in the preceding year which could



1 assist in the development of Iran's nuclear weapons  
2 program; and

3 (2) contains a description of all programs and  
4 projects of the International Atomic Energy Agency  
5 in each country described in section 307(a) of the  
6 Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2227(a))  
7 and any inconsistencies between the technical co-  
8 operation and assistance programs and projects of  
9 the Agency and United States nuclear nonprolifera-  
10 tion and safety goals in these countries.

11 (b) **ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENT.**—The report re-  
12 quired to be submitted under subsection (a) shall be sub-  
13 mitted in an unclassified form, to the extent appropriate,  
14 but may include a classified annex.

15 **SEC. 905. SENSE OF THE CONGRESS.**

16 It is the sense of the Congress that the United States  
17 Government should pursue internal reforms at the Inter-  
18 national Atomic Energy Agency that will ensure that all  
19 programs and projects funded under the Technical Co-  
20 operation and Assistance Fund of the Agency are compat-  
21 ible with United States nuclear nonproliferation policy and  
22 international nuclear nonproliferation norms.
