AMENDMENT TO H.R. 4200, AS REPORTED OFFERED BY MR. HUNTER OF CALIFORNIA

At the end of subtitle A of title XII (page 424, after line 12), insert the following new section:

1	SEC SENSE OF CONGRESS CONCERNING THE ABUSE
2	OF PERSONS IN CUSTODY IN IRAQ.

3 It is the sense of Congress that—

(1) the abuses inflicted upon detainees at the Abu Ghraib prison in Baghdad, Iraq, are offensive to the principles and values of the American people and the United States military, are incompatible with the professionalism, dedication, standards and training required of individuals who serve in the United States military, and contradict the policies, orders, and laws of the United States and the United States military and undermine the ability of the United States military to achieve its mission in Iraq.

(2) the vast majority of members of the Armed Forces have upheld the highest possible standards of professionalism and morality in the face of illegal tactics and terrorist attacks and attempts on their lives.

4	(4) the Armed Forces are moving swiftly and
