3 CRITICAL INFORMATION.

- 4 (a) Defense Guidance.—The Secretary of Defense
- 5 shall establish criteria for determining the types of critical
- 6 information required to be made known expeditiously to
- 7 senior decision makers in the Department of Defense. The
- 8 types of information specified should be matters of ex-
- 9 traordinary significance and potential strategic impact
- 10 and should be immediately necessary to facilitate timely
- 11 information management in the high-level, decision-mak-
- 12 ing process affecting successful mission accomplishment.
- 13 The Secretary may from time to time modify the list to
- 14 suit the current strategic situation, as necessary. The Sec-
