

### **RULES FOR SUPERVISED VISITS**

#### Parents:

While your child(ren) is/are under Foster Custody with the Department of Human Services (DHS) you are being allowed supervised visitations. The following are rules apply:

- 1. No smoking is allowed. Intoxication of alcohol and/or drugs is prohibited.
- 2. Parents are responsible for bringing diapers, diaper wipes, washcloth, toys and games for visits. It is not the foster parent's responsibility.
- 3. DHS encourages nutritious food and drinks. Examples include cut up fresh fruit/vegetables, homemade meals, etc. Sodas and candies not allowed.
- 4. **BE PROMPT.** If late fifteen minutes or more, the visit will be cancelled. If you know that you are unable to make a visit you must call at least a day ahead of time. (Subject to other arrangements)
- 5. If there is evidence of unruly behavior by anyone in the visit, the visit will be terminated. Examples include swearing, yelling, hitting, slapping, degrading, etc.
- 6. Parents are responsible for finding their own transportation to visits not DHS.
- 7. Visitations with your children are not gripe sessions. If you as parents have any concerns or questions about the handling of your case, talk to your social worker.
- 8. Your visits are your time with your children. Make it fun.
- 9. Abstain from talking to the child(ren) about your case including abuse or neglect which the child sufferred.
  - 10. Gift giving must be with the consent of at least the DHS social worker.
  - 11. Only people authorized by the DHS social worker are allowed in the visitation room.
  - 12. You must not remove the child from the visitation site without the DHS social workers approval. Doing so may mean a direct violation of HRS 707-726 AND 727 related to custodial interference and you will be referred to the Police.






