HAWAII DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS TO CONDUCT FREE STATEWIDE SAFETY AND HEALTH TRAINING WORKSHOPS FOR SMALL BUSINESSES

HONOLULU- The State of Hawaii Department of Labor and Industrial Relations' (DLIR),

Hawaii Occupational Safety and Health (HIOSH) Division will sponsor six statewide safety and

health training workshops targeted to Hawaii's small businesses.

The workshops will feature private sector safety and health experts who will actively

engage employers in answering their safety and health questions and providing advice that can

be immediately implemented in their own business. The panel of experts will provide training

workshops on the following topics:

- 1. Understanding Workers Compensation, Drug-Free Workplace and HIOSH
- 2. How to Reduce Injuries & Illness With a Safety Program
- 3. HIOSH's Most Common Violations and How to Avoid Them
- 4. Emergency Preparedness for Small Businesses

The workshops will be conducted in six locations on four islands (Oahu, Big Island, Maui

& Kauai) and are open to the public, free of charge.

These workshops are designed for small business owners and managers who often do

not have the resources to hire professional safety and health experts. The workshops will

enable these employers and mangers understand and navigate through Hawaii's complicated safety and health regulations and assist them in developing an effective safety and health plans to ensure the safety of their employees and control costs.

The workshops will offer employers advice on how to lower the high costs of workers compensation and reduce employee injuries and lost work days. Additionally, employers looking to combat substance abuse in the workplace will be able to get advice and guidance on how to establish drug-free work program. Further, employers will also be provided information and direction on how to establish an emergency preparedness plan for their business.
