HAWAI'I'S SEASONALLY ADJUSTED UNEMPLOYMENT RATE AT 2.3 PERCENT IN FEBRUARY

Hawai'i Maintains Lowest Unemployment Rate in the Nation for the 7th Straight Month

HONOLULU- The Hawai'i State Department of Labor and Industrial Relations announced today that the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for February was 2.3 percent, a slight increase of 0.1 percentage point over January. The national seasonally adjusted unemployment rate is 4.5 percent, a decline of 0.1 percentage point over-the-month. One year ago, the Hawai'i and U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rates stood at 2.5 percent and 4.8 percent. Since July 2006, Hawai'i's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate has been below 2.5 percent.

In February, Hawai'i's seasonally adjusted labor force totaled 649,000, and was comprised of 634,150 employed and 14,850 unemployed. Over-the-year, the number of employed has grown by 10,350, while the number of unemployed has decreased by 1,100.

Industry Payroll Employment

In another measure of employment, total seasonally adjusted nonagricultural jobs increased over-the-month by 1,100 to 624,900. The expansion in jobs in February over January was shared between Trade, Transportation & Utilities and Government. In comparison with February 2006, the seasonally adjusted jobcount rose by 13,000 or 2.1 percent with the private sector accounting for an increase of 10,500 jobs or 80.8 percent of the total growth. Within the private sector, while Trade, Transportation, & Utilities (+2,000) gained the most jobs, Construction (+4.5 percent) expanded by the largest percentage.

❖ Government (+1,400)

There was little change in federal and local government, increasing slightly by 100 jobs. However, the gain of 1,200 jobs in state government was partly due to the Department of Education's continual transition to its new school schedule. Majority of the growth was due to more hiring at the Department of Education and the University of Hawai'i.

Trade, Transportation & Utilities (+700)

Over-the-month, Wholesale Trade experienced a slight loss of 100 jobs. Retail

Trade continued to trend up adding 300 jobs some of which were due to more hiring
in Waikiki's new stores as well as in building material and supplies dealers.

❖ Educational & Health Care Services (+100)

The minimal increase in this sector occurred in physicians offices.

Other Services (+100)


This miscellaneous group edged up slightly.

Construction (No change)

Construction remained essentially unchanged.

Leisure & Hospitality (No change)

Arts, entertainment & recreation lost 100 jobs mainly in amusement parks. The Accommodation & Food Services sector, which exhibited jobs gains for the fourth consecutive month added 100 jobs over-the-month. Restaurant establishments accounted for the increase.



"It is truly remarkable that Hawai'i's economy has maintained a seasonally adjusted monthly unemployment rate below three percent that dates back to the beginning of 2004," said Nelson Befitel, Director of Labor and Industrial Relations. "Our working families have certainly benefited from the state's vibrant and expending economy."

Unemployment Trust Fund

To keep the public informed on the status of the state's Unemployment Compensation Fund (Fund), from which unemployment benefits are paid to qualified claimants, the following is the status as of the end of February 2007 and its projected balance at the end of the year.


For comparison purposes, in calendar year 2006 the Fund collected \$142.2 million in taxes and paid out \$90.6 million in benefits.
