HAWAI'I'S SEASONALLY ADJUSTED UNEMPLOYMENT RATE AT 2.5 PERCENT IN MARCH

Number of employed people has expanded by 15,200 over the past year

HONOLULU- The Hawai'i State Department of Labor and Industrial Relations announced today that the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for March was 2.5 percent, an increase of 0.2 percentage point over February's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate of 2.3 percent. The national seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in March was 4.4 percent, a decrease of 0.1 percent from the previous month. Over the last 12 months, Hawai'i's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate has been on average 2.3 percentage points lower than the national seasonally adjusted unemployment rate.

In March, Hawai'i's seasonally adjusted labor force totaled 655,450, and was composed of 639,400 employed and 16,100 unemployed. Over-the-year, the number of employed has expanded by 15,200, or 2.4 percent, while the number of unemployed has contracted by 750, or 4.5 percent.

Industry Payroll Employment

In another measure of employment, total seasonally adjusted nonagricultural jobs grew over-the-month by 1,000 to 625,600. The largest gain in jobs between March over February was in Leisure and Hospitality (+600) followed by Trade, Transportation, & Utilities (+400). Over-the-year, the seasonally adjusted jobcount rose by 12,400 or 2.0 percent. Within the private sector, the sectors showing most notable job gains included: Construction (+1,800),

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Leisure and Hospitality (+1,500) and Education and Health Services (+1,400). Construction (+5.1 percent) expanded by the largest percentage.

Leisure & Hospitality (+700)

Arts, Entertainment, Recreation rose slightly by 100 jobs, while the bulk of the growth occurred in Accommodation and Food Services, rising by 600 jobs. Accommodation rose minimally, however Food Services accounted for most of this gain as more restaurants continued to open in Waikiki. Overall, this major group exhibited over-the-month percentage increases for the fifth consecutive month.

❖ Trade, Transportation & Utilities (+400)

Wholesale Trade remained relatively stable. Retail Trade accounted for 300 of the increase, most of which were concentrated in clothing and clothing accessories and general merchandise stores throughout the state.

❖ Construction (+200)

Majority of the growth was due to the increase in residential building construction, which was offset by a slight drop in special trade contractors.

Educational & Health Services (+200)


Education Service and Health Care and Social Assistance each reported a minimal increase of 100 jobs. Most of the increase in health care and social assistance was notable in doctors' offices.

❖ Government (-100)

Federal government recorded a slight gain of 100 jobs while State government lost 200 jobs in the Department of Education. Local government registered no change.

Other Services (-200)

This miscellaneous group reported a drop of 200 jobs in various industry series mainly in grant-making and giving services and commercial and industrial machinery and equipment repair and maintenance.



"Long-term job growth across numerous industrial sectors has given local residents a wide array of employment opportunities," said Nelson Befitel, Director of Labor and Industrial Relations.


For comparison purposes, in calendar year 2006 the Fund collected \$142.2 million in taxes and paid out \$90.6 million in benefits.

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
