## HAWAI'l'S SEASONALLY ADJUSTED UNEMPLOYMENT RATE DROPS TO 2.4 PERCENT IN APRIL

Since April of 2006, the number of unemployed has dropped by 1,150 persons

HONOLULU- The Hawai'i State Department of Labor and Industrial Relations announced today that the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for April was 2.4 percent, a decline of 0.1 percentage point from March's rate of 2.5 percent.

[^0]In April, there were 637,500 employed and 15,800 unemployed, for a total seasonally adjusted labor force of 653,250. Over-the-month, the seasonally adjusted labor force was reduced by 2,200, or 0.3 percentage point. Compared with April 2006, the number of employed has expanded by 13,400 , or 2.1 percent, while the number of unemployed has gone down by 1,150, or 6.9 percent.

"We remain pleased that the State's strong economy continues to foster a job market that has kept the unemployment rate at an extremely low level, and allowed a significant number of previously unemployed workers to find employment," said Nelson B. Befitel, Director of Labor and Industrial Relations."

## Industry Payroll Employment

In another measure of employment, total seasonally adjusted nonagricultural jobs decreased over-the-month by 3,500 to 621,300 . The bulk of the job losses occurred in Government, mainly in State Government due to the intersession break in public education. However, compared with April 2006, the seasonally adjusted jobcount registered a gain of 8,500 or 1.3 percent. Within the private sector, the sectors experiencing the largest job growth were in Construction \& Leisure \& Hospitality (+2,200 each) and Education and Health Services $(+1,800)$.

## * Educational \& Health Services (+200)

This industry group posted an increase in jobs for the third consecutive month. Educational
Services grew by 400 jobs as private schools continued to add more staff to their payroll.
Health Care and Social Assistance dropped by 200 jobs mainly in programs supporting individual and family services.

## * Leisure \& Hospitality (+100)

The Leisure \& Hospitality sector reported jobs increases for the sixth consecutive month. Accommodation \& Food Services accounted for the gain of 100 jobs, occurring in hotels. Arts, Entertainment \& Recreation remained unchanged due to the growth in museums, historical sites, and similar institutions being overshadowed by the loss of jobs in performing arts, spectator sports and related industries.

## * Other Services (No Change)

This miscellaneous group remained stable. The increase in business, professional, labor and political organizations was offset by the drop in social advocacy organizations.

## * Construction (-100)

Construction jobs edged down slightly in both residential and non residential building. However, with an increase in construction activities due to more nonresidential building filing of permits, jobs will continue to trend upward. Over-the-year, this sector rose by 2,200 jobs or 6.3 percent from April 2006.

## * Trade, Transportation \& Utilities (-100)

Wholesale and Retail Trades both recorded no change over-the-month. The minimal loss of 100 jobs occurred in the cruise industry. While, the anticipated relocation of a cruise ship planned for next year may reflect lower job counts in transportation, a new surge of retail stores planned to open will produce gain in the trade industry.

## * Government (-3,800)

Federal Government edged down by 200 jobs while local government remained essentially unchanged. State Government comprised the majority of the decline due to the Department of Education releasing staff during the intersession break, attributing to its transition to the year round schedule.


## Unemployment Trust Fund

To keep the public informed on the status of the state's Unemployment Compensation Fund (Fund), from which unemployment benefits are paid to qualified claimants, the following is the status as of the end of April 2007 and its projected balance at the end of the year.
