# DEPARTMENT OF LABOR ANNOUNCES THE 2004 CONSTRUCTION CAREER EXPO

Expo to Promote Well Paying Jobs in Hawaii's Different Construction Trade **Organizations** 

Honolulu- The Department of Labor and Industrial Relations (DLIR) announced today that it will sponsor the Construction Career Expo at the Blaisdell Center Exhibition Hall on Wednesday, October 20, 2004. The Expo is a joint venture between the DLIR, U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Apprentice and Training (US DOL), and the Apprenticeship and Training Coordinators Association of Hawaii.

In keeping with U.S. DOL's "Skills to Build America's Future Initiative" and in an effort to heighten public awareness of the career opportunities available in the construction industry, the Expo will provide detailed information about various construction occupations and will expose potential applicants to promising and lucrative jobs in the construction trades. Attendees will be able to find detailed information about trade entrance standards and job performance requirements, view demonstration and

ask questions of trades professionals. In addition, attendees will have the chance to

speak with training program providers who may be able to assist eligible individuals

prepare to enter the trades. The goal is to create a larger pool of better-informed and

better-qualified jobseekers for the construction industry.

In February, Governor Linda Lingle testified before the United States Senate

Appropriations Committee on Labor, Health and Human Services and Education on the

increasing apprehension that Hawaii may be facing a lack of skilled workers to sustain

industry growth. Local economists have highlighted the fact that the construction

industry in Hawaii is recovering from years of decline. A more robust economy, low

interest rates, as well as increased construction and renovation of military housing in the

state have fueled this recovery.

"Construction is one of the state's vital industries and its recent activity has

helped kickstart our economic recovery," said Nelson B. Befitel, Director of Labor and

Industrial Relations. "To secure our future, we will need the skills and talents of a new

generation of trades workers to fill the jobs created by a stronger economy and those to

be vacated by retiring Baby Boomers."
