HAWAII MAINTAINS LOWEST UNEMPLOYMENT RATE IN THE NATION

Hawaii's Unemployment rate of 2.9 percent is the only Rate in the U.S. Below 3.0 Percent

HONOLULU- The Hawaii State Department of Labor and Industrial Relations announced today that the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for April was 2.9 percent, a slight increase from March's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate of 2.8 percent. In comparison, the U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate remained unchanged over-themonth at 5.2 percent. No state in the nation has an unemployment rate below 3.0 percent. One year ago, Hawaii's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 3.4 percent, while the national seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5.5 percent.

In April, Hawaii's seasonally adjusted labor force totaled 631,050 and was comprised of 612,600 employed and 18,500 unemployed. Over-the year, these totals reflect labor force expansion of 2.6 percent and employment growth of 3.1 percent. In contrast, the number of unemployed compared with April 2004 has declined by 11.2 percent.

In a separate measure of employment, Hawaii's seasonally adjusted nonagricultural

jobcount in April stood at 594,700, an increase of 1,800 over March. Since December of 2002,

Hawaii's economy has added 30,900 new jobs.

Trade, Transportation, & Utilities expanded by 900 jobs over-the-month, in part due to

hiring for a new cruise ship. Construction, Leisure & Hospitality, and Government rose by 300

jobs each, while Education & Health Services and Other Services increased by 200 and 100

jobs respectively. Manufacturing experienced a decline in April over March of 300 jobs. Over-

the-year, within the seasonally adjusted industry series, Trade, Transportation, & Utilities has

added the most jobs (+4,600, +4.1%), while Construction has gone up by the highest

percentage (+2,900, +10.1%).

"Our economy is strong and you see that reflected in our employment numbers and the

30,900 new jobs created since the beginning of the Lingle-Aiona Administration," said Nelson

Befitel, Director of Labor & Industrial Relations. "It an employee's market which is great news

to those graduating from college and high school this month."
