Date of Last Increase: 1998 - 2000.

Reason for New Fee or Fee Change: Loss of the Department of Labor Senior Employment program (SCSEP) has led to increased operation and maintenance costs. Also, inflation has increased the cost of basic supplies and contracts.

If recommended, the fee increase will be used for: 1) facility operations and maintenance expenses, 2) continue a high standard of cleanliness and comfort that Forest visitors expect; 3) address backlog maintenance needs.

If recommended, the proposal will be implemented: March, 2008

## Price Comparisons for Similar Facilities & Services:

Forest Service: Camping fees at similar facilities on the north zone of the Monongahela NF range from \$10.00 to \$16.00 per night for individual campsites. Fees on the adjacent George Washington NF range from \$6.00 to \$16.00 for individual campsites.

Local Private and Public Providers: There are no comparable private facilities in the area; the local facilities are full hook-up RV sites. Nearby State Park campgrounds charge \$17.00 per night.
