ExpandedAmenityFee: Thisallowsfeestobechargedforfacilitiesorse rvicesthat providedirectbenefitstopeople. Specificameniti esarerequired. This includes developedcampgrounds, highlydevelopedboatlaunch es, cabinrentals, hook-ups, dumpstations,transportationservices,andreserva tionservices.

SpecialRecreationPermitFee: Whereextrameasuresareneededfornaturaland culturalresourceprotection, the health and safety ofvisitors, to allocate capacity or disperserecreationuse. Examples include: Wilderne ssAreas, Shooting Ranges, SpecializedTrails, etc.
