
Broadband



Competition

 Clarified automatic roaming obligations of CMRS providers

- Approved several wireless transactions, including:
 - Atlantis/Alltel
 - AT&T/Dobson
 - América Móvil/Verizon





Spectrum

- Established service rules and auction procedures for 700 MHz Band
- Auction of 62 MHz of spectrum in 700 MHz Band scheduled to begin January 24, 2008
- Finalized rules and commenced licensing in 3650-3700 MHz Band
 - Granted 81 nationwide licenses
- Completed 5 spectrum auctions in 2007
 - Sold 293 licenses
 - Raised \$162.3 million





Licensing

- Administered 3 million licenses
- Processed 461,184 applications
 - 175,020 New Licenses/Renewals/STA
 - 85,241 License Modifications
 - 26,158 Transfers and Assignments
 - 174,765 Other Requests (e.g., construction notifications/administrative updates)
- Completed review of all AWS-1 applications in just over 6 months
- Achieved lowest level of pending items since WTB began tracking in 1999



Innovation

- Established Open Platform requirement for 700 MHz Band Upper C Block
- Established Public Safety/Private
 Partnership for 700 MHz Upper D Block
- Issued report and initiated rulemaking examining the effectiveness of the hearing aid compatibility requirements in an evolving marketplace of new technologies and services
