Recent Trends: US Study 🔶 2.9%

- Georgian Scholarship Program for Education Professionals funded by OSI, the Georgian Ministry of Education, Harvard University, and Columbia University – offers MA studies to support higher education reform.
- An additional year was added (from 11 to 12) to the secondary education system in 2007.
- Unified National Admissions Examination has been required since 2005 for undergraduate study and since 2007 for graduate study.
- Fields of study most inquired: business administration, law, international relations, public administration, and education.
- Common sports for student-athletes: tennis, soccer, and basketball.
