EAS offers a full range of advising services and outreach events for prospective students and parents, in collaboration with 12 Regional and Secondary Information Centers.

## Recent Trends: US Study 4 2.0%

- The number of UK students choosing to study in the US continues to grow, with a 2% increase in 2006/07 (Open Doors, 2007).
- Likewise, the UK remains the leading destination for US students, with more than 45,000 Americans studying in the UK in 2006/07 (Open Doors 2007, UKCISA).
- UK students and parents increasingly rely on the EAS informational website and outreach events for information on US universities and service providers.
- Growing interest in short-term study, academic scholarships and post-doctoral research.
