### **Instructions for Reporting by Occupation**

Report part-time workers in the job they perform.

Report apprentices in the job for which they are being trained.

Report employees in the following ways:

- Use the description of duties along with the job titles to determine where to place employees. Do not rely on job titles alone.
- Report employees in the occupations in which they are working, not necessarily in occupations for which they have been trained. For example: An employee trained as an engineer, but working as a drafter, should be reported as a drafter.
