Analytes to measure: Due to the difficulties with the fenofibrate assay, only the metabolite, fenofibric acid, should be measured.

Bioequivalence based on (90% CI): Fenofibric Acid

Waiver request of in-vivo testing: 48 mg based on (i) acceptable bioequivalence studies on the 145 mg strength, (ii) proportional similarity of the formulations 48 mg and 145 mg strengths, and (iii) acceptable in vitro dissolution testing of 48 mg and 145 mg strengths.
