Form/Route:	Tablets/Oral
Recommended studies:	2 studies
1. Type of study: Fasting Design: Single-dose, two-way crossover <i>in-vivo</i>	

Strength: 25 mg/300 mg Subjects: Normal healthy males and females, general population. Additional Comments: Females should not be pregnant, and if applicable, should practice abstention or contraception during the study.

 Type of study: Fed Design: Single-dose, two-way crossover *in-vivo* Strength: 25 mg/300 mg Subjects: Normal healthy males and females, general population. Additional comments: Please see comment above.

Analytes to measure: Hydrochlorothiazide and irbesartan in plasma

Bioequivalence based on (90% CI): Hydrochlorothiazide and irbesartan

**Waiver request of in-vivo testing:** 12.5mg/ 150 mg and 12.5 mg /300 mg based on (i) acceptable bioequivalence studies on the 25 mg/300 mg strength, (ii) proportionally similar across all strengths, and (iii) acceptable in vitro dissolution testing of all strengths.
