FEDERAL FISHERIES AGENCY OFFERS EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES FOR FISHERMEN CONSIDERING COOPERATIVE FISHERIES RESEARCH

NOAA's Fisheries Service today announced a new effort to help commercial fishermen in the Northeast to develop, fund and engage in cooperative fishery research aboard their vessels. The agency has published a guide to developing and funding projects, complemented by a website that provides additional information and resources.

The guide is entitled *Working Together: Developing a Cooperative Research Project and Proposal.* It covers such things as identifying a research topic, establishing partnerships with scientists preparing proposals, and administering funds. The website has an online version of the guide, as well as more detailed "how-to" information for cooperative research applicants including priority needs for research, links to potential cooperative research funding sources, and instructions for how to get the permits, if necessary, to conduct research.

"The partnerships forged through cooperative fisheries research -- between industry members, scientists, and managers – help to improve the quality and expand the kinds of information available to support sound fisheries management decisions," said John Hoey, who manages cooperative research efforts for NOAA Fisheries Service in the Northeast.

The availability of federal funds for cooperative research varies year to year, subject to Congressional appropriations. NOAA Fisheries Service's largest cooperative research program in the region was established in 1999 in conjunction with the New England Fishery Management Council. The Northeast Cooperative Research Partners Program (NCRPP) is one of 6 regional cooperative research programs nationwide. The NCRPP has funded more than \$26 million in cooperative research projects both large and small.

In general, cooperative research provides commercial fishing industry participants more opportunity to provide their empirical knowledge of the sea, and marine life, to scientists and managers. This enhances the science that is used to inform fishery managers.
