The Stem Cell Therapeutic and Research Act of 2005: Overview

- Public Law 109-129
 Signed December 20, 2005
 Aims are to increase:
 - Number of unrelated donor transplants
 - Public Inventory of high quality CBU from diverse populations
 - Number of CBU available for research

The Stem Cell Therapeutic and Research Act of 2005: Overview (cont'd)

Key Elements of New Law:

- National Cord Blood Inventory to collect high quality CBU from Diverse populations for use in unrelated-donor transplant; target of 150,000 <u>new</u> units
- C.W. Bill Young Cell Transplantation Program to facilitate transplants with cells from cord blood and bone marrow, collect data on transplant outcomes
- Establishment of the new HHS Advisory Council on Blood Stem Cell Transplantation for these programs

Opportunity to help more patients obtain transplants, other therapies

Establishment of Advisory Council on Blood Stem Cell Transplantation

Purpose:

 Consider and make recommendations to the Secretary of HHS, and HRSA, on matters related to the C. W. Bill Young Cell Transplantation Program

- Advisory Council charter published in the Federal Register on January 23, 2007 with nominations for membership solicited by February 22, 2007
 - Over 100 nominations of highly qualified candidates received by HRSA

<u>Advisory Council Membership</u>

Consisting of up to 25 voting members, the law requires reps from:

- Marrow donor and transplant centers
- Cord blood banks
- Birthing hospitals
- Blood stem cell recipients/ family members

<u>Advisory Council Membership</u> (cont'd):

- Persons with expertise in blood stem cell transplantation (Cord blood & Bone Marrow)
- Persons with expertise in typing, matching, and transplant outcome data analysis
- Persons with expertise in the social sciences
- Basic scientists with expertise in the biology of adult stem cells
- Members of the general public

Ex-Officio (Non-voting) Members

- Department of Defense Marrow Donor Program operated by the Dept. of Navy
- Division of Transplantation of HRSA
- FDA
- NIH
- CDC
- CMS

Possible Topics for Advisory Council:

- Targets for National Cord Blood Inventory & Adult Registry-size & composition
- Research Priorities
 - HPC transplantation
 - Other therapy with cells from CB & BM
 - Criteria for releasing units for research
- Informed Consent Requirements
- Accreditation Recommendations

Possible topics, cont'd

- Confidentiality Issues
- Key CBU Characteristics that Improve Outcomes
- Criteria for recommending specific stem cell sources for varying diagnoses, demographics, and clinical conditions
- Public & Professional Education re donation
- Strategies and resources to expand opportunities for eligible pregnant women to publicly bank their infants' CBU

Possible topics, cont'd

- Regulatory Policy including international harmonization of regulation and importation issues
- Public and Private Insurers actions to increase donation and access to transplant
- State and Federal Government actions (other than as insurers) to increase donation and access to transplant

<u>Advisory Council, cont'd</u>

- Status of Council as of this meeting:
 - Nominations are under review in the Department
 - Uncertain when appointments by the Secretary will be made
 - A Meeting Logistics contract has been awarded to support the Council
 - We are prepared to hold first meeting late fall 2007
