### HOP STOCKS - UNITED STATES

The inventory of hops held by growers, dealers, and brewers on September 1, 2007 totaled 47.0 million pounds, down 4 percent from September 1, 2006 and 22 percent below two years ago. This is the lowest September 1 inventory since 1981 when stocks were 34.4 million pounds.

Stocks held by brewers, at 31.0 million pounds, were down 11 percent from a year ago and 6 percent below September 1, 2005. Stocks held by growers and dealers on September 1, 2007 were 16.0 million pounds, up 14 percent from last year, but down 41 percent from September 1, 2005.

# POULTRY



Washington's egg production totaled 106 million during August 2007, 2 million less than in August 2006. All layers in Washington during August 2007 averaged 4.7 million, down 2 percent from a year ago. Six percent of the layers were being molted as of September 1, 2007, while 41.0 percent of all the layers had completed at least one molting in their lifetime. U.S. egg production totaled 7.57 billion during August 2007, down 1 percent from last year. Production included 6.44 billion table eggs and 1.13 billion hatching eggs. During August 2007, all layers in the United States totaled 339.0 million layers, down 1 percent from last year. Egg-type chicks hatched in the United States during August

2007 totaled 36.8 million up 3 percent from August 2006. Eggs in incubators totaled 35.3 million on September 1, 2007, down 4 percent from a year ago.

# WASHINGTON POTATOES

The final value of Washington's 2006 potato crop was \$561.9 million, 5 percent higher than the 2005 crop of \$534.7 million. The 2006 market year average price received by Washington growers of \$6.25 per cwt. was 65 cents above the 2005 average price of \$5.60. Processors in Washington and Oregon (excluding Malheur County) used a total of 77.4 million cwt. of 2006 crop potatoes compared with 78.6 million cwt. used in 2005 and 78.7 million cwt. used in 2004. Of the total potatoes processed in the Nation, Washington and other Oregon processors accounted for 36.2 percent.

# **COLD STORAGE**

Total fresh apples in storage for the United States on August 31, 2007 totaled 99.2 million pounds, which was an increase of 19 percent from the amount in storage a year ago. Frozen French fries in storage for the three Pacific Coast states and eight Mountain states on August 31, 2007, totaled 548.8 million pounds, and accounted for 69 percent of the Nation's French fries in storage. Total potatoes in storage for the three Pacific Coast states and eight Mountain states on August 31, 2007, totaled 671.0 million pounds, 67 percent of the Nation's total potatoes in storage.
