





Farms and Ranches: 1974 - 2002






Type of Organization: 2002





Distribution of Farms by Economic Class: 2002







Selected Farm Production Expenses: 1997 and 2002






NAICS classifies farms based on primary activity. Each farm is represented once, categorized by the product accounting for 50% or more of the total production value; farms with no single product accounting for 50% or more are classified as "other."


