While not prescriptive nor to be interpreted as a directive to incur additional costs or an approval of the allowability of any such costs, the "Operational Security General Information" (available at http://www.usaid.gov/policy/ads/300/303sae.pdf) includes topics and information which may be of interest to your and your staff, such as:

- · organizational security and safety planning,
- emergency planning and evacuation procedures,
- trip planning and situational awareness in the area of travel, and
- effective and reliable voice communication systems, including telephone trees.
