Goal 1:


- a) To systematically identify the children of inmates in need of support

Start-Up Goals





- Goal 2: To strengthen bonds between children and their caregivers, including the incarcerated parent(s)
- Goal 3: To mitigate childhood trauma caused by the arrest
- Goal 4: Where appropriate, to increase the likelihood of successful reunification with incarcerated parents
- Goal 5: To raise community awareness and knowledge


Miami-Dade to Palm Beach County Map of "FA Incidents"





Firearms Arrest Hotspots (Crime Stat) & UCR Crime Rate




Firearms Arrest Hotspots (Crime Stat) & DJJ Referrals








Miami-Dade Reentry Addresses for Offenders Scheduled for Release between Apr - June 30, 2006






Miami-Dade Reentry Addresses for Offenders Scheduled for Release between July - Sept 31, 2006






Miami-Dade Reentry Addresses for Offenders Scheduled for Release between Oct - Dec 31, 2006







Figure 4: Normal Distribution of At-Risk Children and Normal Distribution of At-Risk Children of Inmates







Children between Ages 5 - 17 by Census Tract






Miami-Dade ReEntry Addresses for Offenders Age 18-50




Miami-Dade ReEntry Addresses for Female Offenders Age 18-50










Miami Reentry Addresses* for Gang Members Scheduled for Release between Jan 1- Jul 30, 2006








Care Coordination Centers Geographic Distribution

- Creating Performance Measures for Activities
- Establishing Baseline Measurement Tools
- Forming "Layer" Thought Patterns
 - Framework for Feedback Evaluation
 - Children served per block group
 - Contacts made per zip code
 - Cultural Diversity
 - Capacity to Manage Multi-Disciplinary Concepts
 - Integrated Analysis Techniques
