

**ROBERT J. WALTERS**  
Assistant Inspector General  
for Investigations

Robert J. Walters has over thirty years in the law enforcement field. He started his law enforcement career in 1973 as a Patrol Officer with the U.S. Army. After serving three years in the military, Mr. Walters left the service and joined the Tompkins County Sheriff's Department in upstate New York where he served as a Deputy Sheriff.

In 1981, Mr. Walters re-entered the U.S. Army and was selected to become a Special Agent with the United States Army Criminal Investigation Division. Working up through the ranks as a Special Agent within the Army's Criminal Investigation Division (CID), Mr. Walters served as a member of the General Crimes Team; Senior Agent, Procurement Fraud Team; Team Chief, Economic Crimes Team; and Special Agent-in-Charge. He possesses a Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice and also has certificates in contract and grant management.

After retiring from the U.S. Army in 1998, Mr. Walters served as a Protective Service Officer at the Department of Justice in Washington, DC. In 1999, Mr. Walters was appointed as a Special Agent within the Office of Inspector General at the Corporation for National and Community Service. As a Senior Special Agent, he was responsible for supporting the OIG's mission to detect, investigate, and prevent fraud, waste, and abuse in agency programs and operations. In December 2004, Mr. Walters was appointed as the Assistant Inspector General for Investigations.

Mr. Walters is a member of the CID Agents Association, the Fraternal Order of Police, and a life member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the Disabled American Veterans. He is married to the former Sharon Stark of Lansing, New York. Mr. and Mrs. Walters reside in Woodbridge, Virginia.
