April 8<sup>th</sup>: Federal Trade Commission Reauthorization IIII Add To My Calendar

This will be an oversight hearing reviewing the performance of the Commission.

April 8<sup>th</sup>: Oversight of DTV Transition Add To My Calendar

The Full Committee will examine U.S. readiness for the nationwide transition from analog television broadcasting to digital television (DTV) broadcasting. The hearing will focus on consumer awareness, the role of broadcasters and the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), and the status of the National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) converter box program.

April 9<sup>th</sup>: Coal Gasification Technologies Add To My Calendar

The Science, Technology, and Innovation Subcommittee will examine coal gasification technologies, including the challenges and advantages over traditional technologies, and the need for large scale integrated gasification combined cycle (IGCC) demonstration projects that feature carbon capture and sequestration.

April 10<sup>th</sup>: Aviation Safety Oversight Hearing Add To My Calendar

There have been a series of high-profile events that have raised concerns regarding the Federal Aviation Administration's (FAA) oversight of safety in the National Airspace System (NAS). This hearing will examine these safety issues regarding the inspections, runway safety and operational errors. The hearing will also review the FAA's implementation of the Air Transportation Oversight System (ATOS), the new systematic approach the agency has implemented to address safety oversight.
