## **Commerce Committee Hearings**

April 22<sup>nd</sup>: The Future of the Internet

This hearing focused on developing applications, consumer expectations, and network operation for the Internet.

April 22<sup>nd</sup>: Moving Passengers and Freight into the Future

This hearing examined recommendations relating to highway, auto, and truck safety; freight mobility; passenger and freight rail capacity and service development; intermodal transportation; and the integration of our surface, maritime, and aviation networks.

April 23<sup>rd</sup>: Phantom Traffic

This full committee hearing examined concerns regarding voice traffic over telephone networks that are sent without identifying information used for intercarrier billing purposes, also known as "phantom traffic." This has become a problem for many rural carriers throughout America and is resulting in higher consumer prices. Senator Stevens introduced the "Signal Modernization Act of 2008," (S. 2919) to address this problem. It was cosponsored by Commerce Committee Chairman Daniel Inouye (D-Hawaii) and Senators Byron Dorgan (D-N.D.), Gordon Smith (R-Ore.), Mark Pryor (D-Ark.), John Thune (R-S.D.) and Olympia Snowe (R-Maine).

April 24th: National Nanotechnology Initiative: Charting the Course for Reauthorization

This hearing examined the five year period since the National Nanotechnology Initiative (NNI) was initially authorized in 2003 and explored issues the Committee should consider for the next reauthorization.
