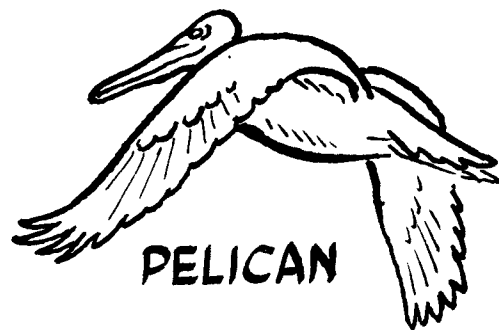
RACCOON

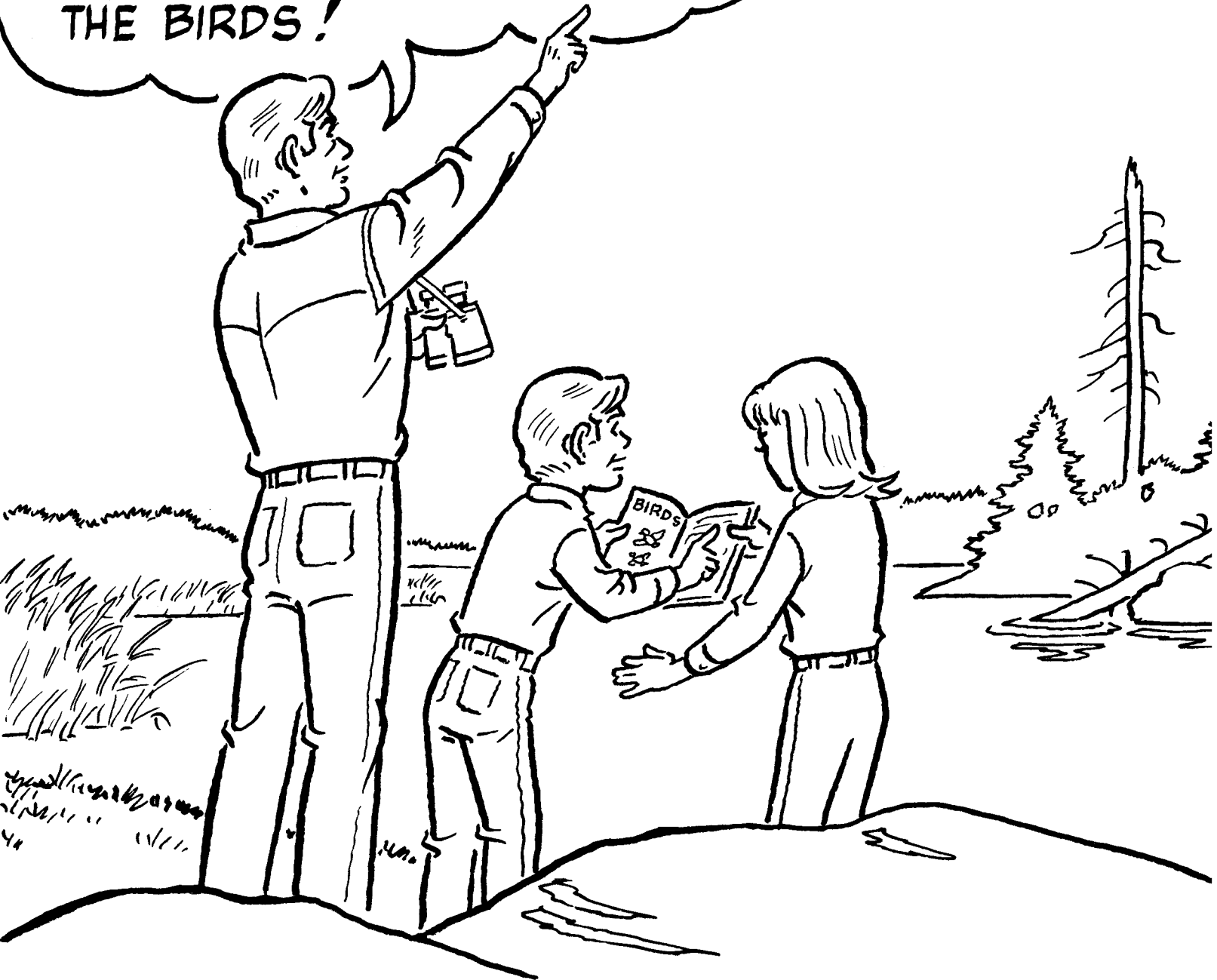
MOOSE

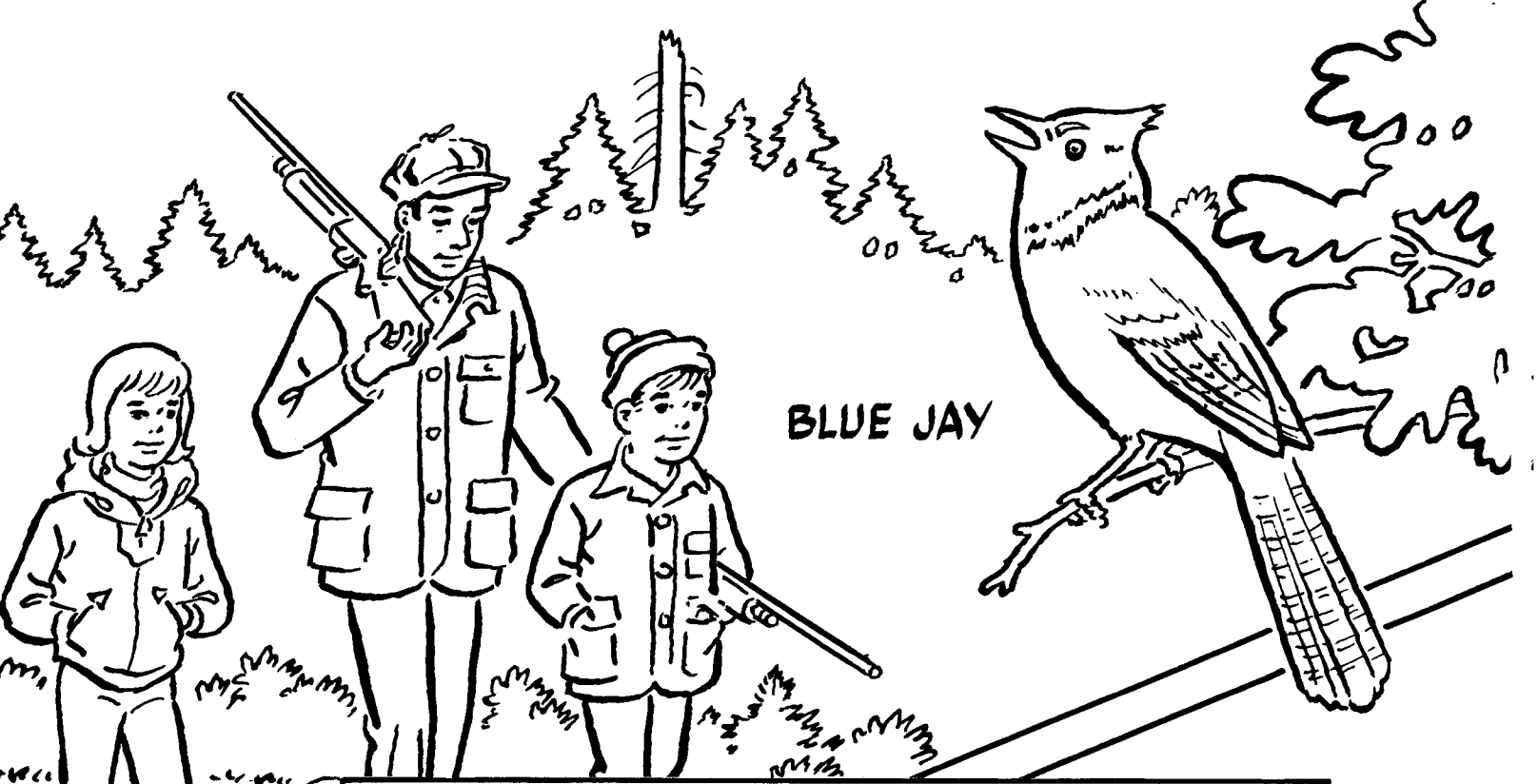




**BALD EAGLE**

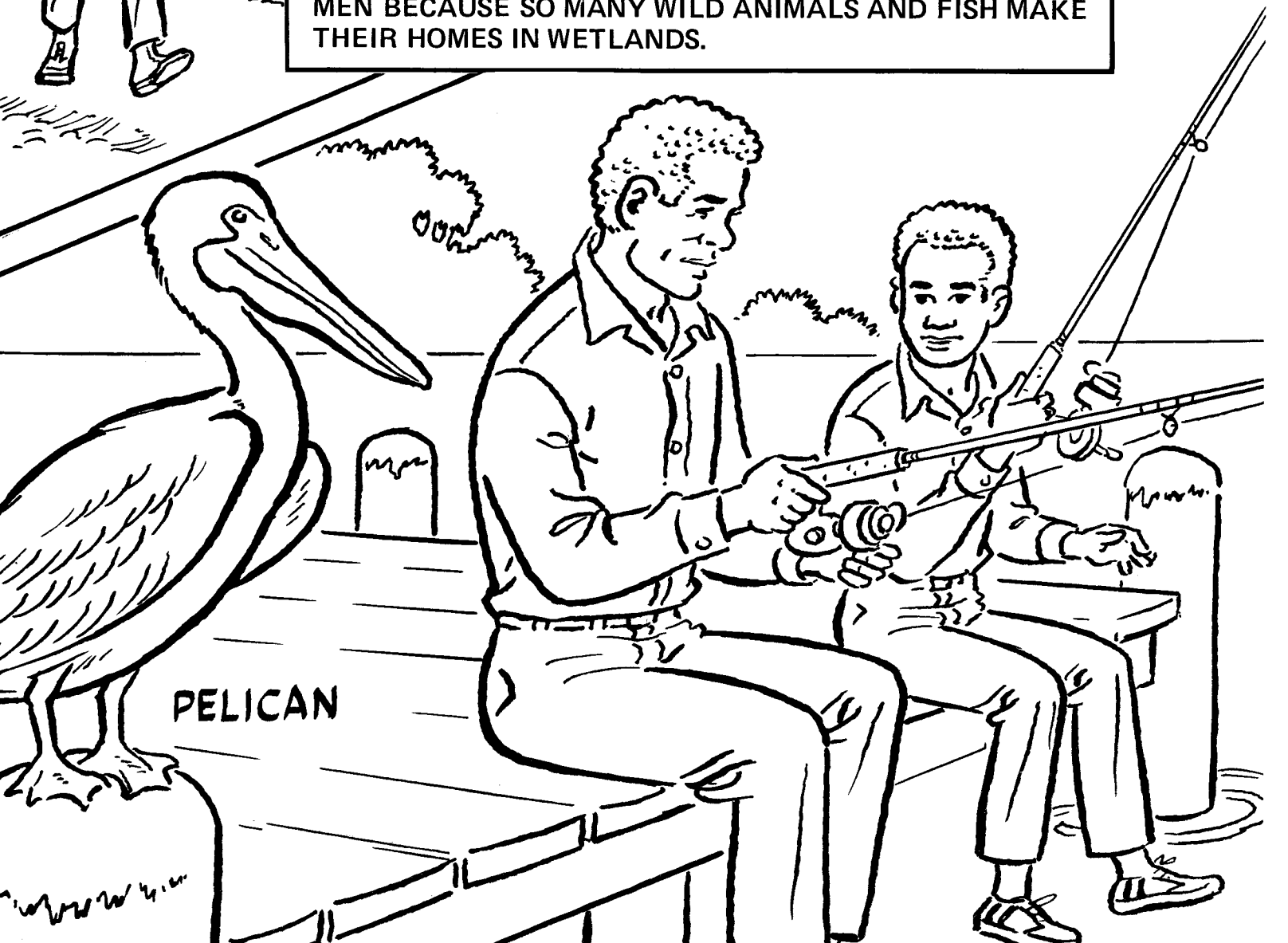

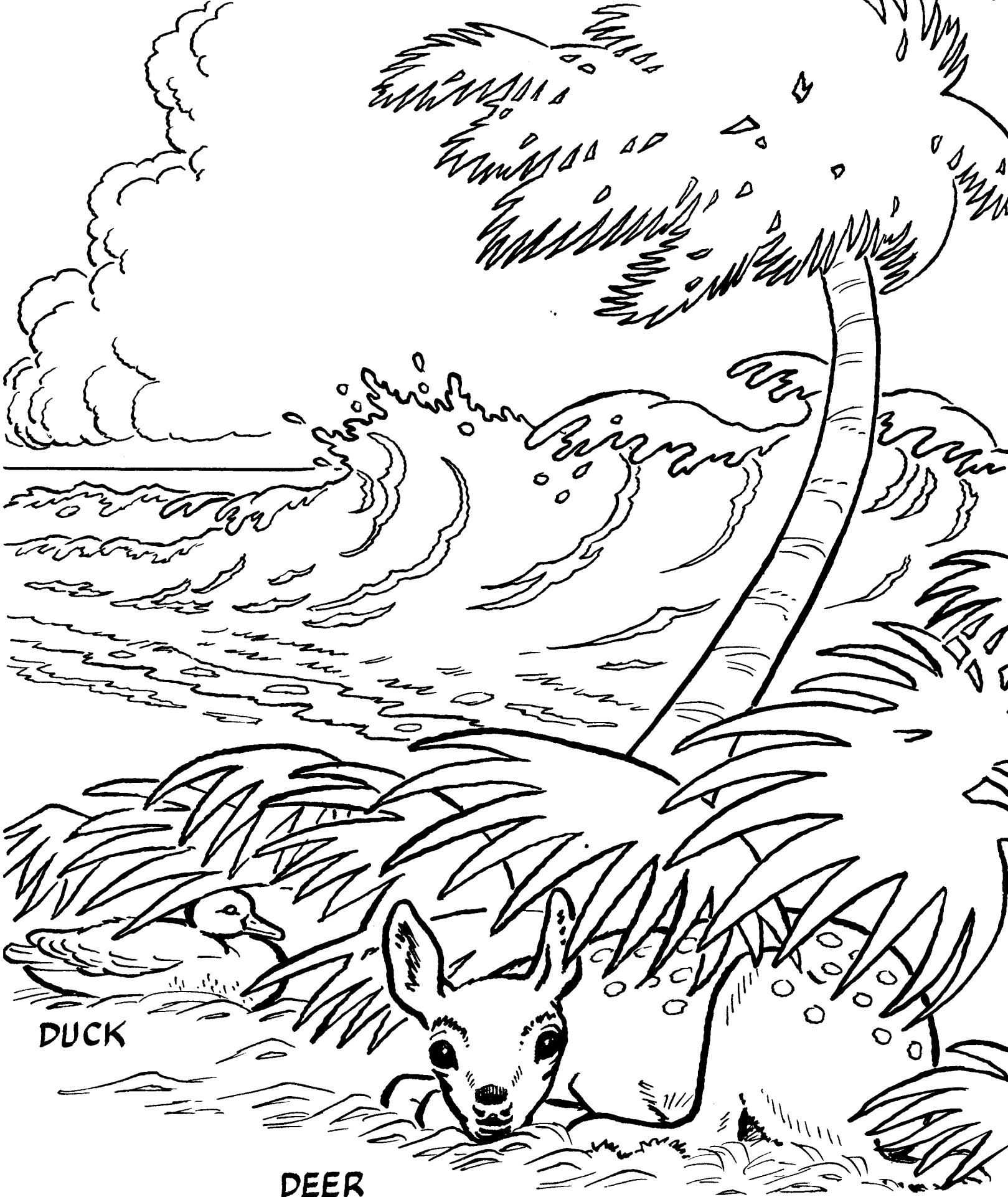


BLUE JAY

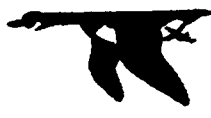

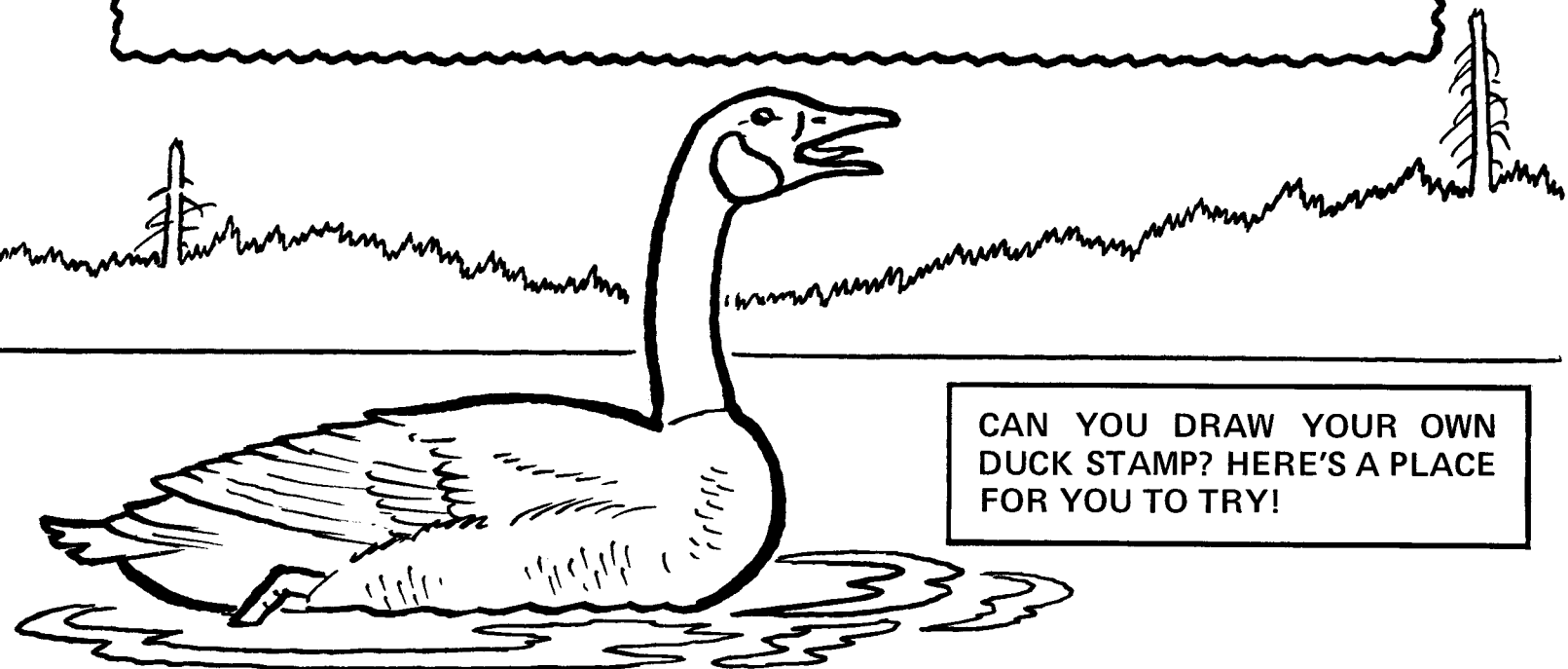
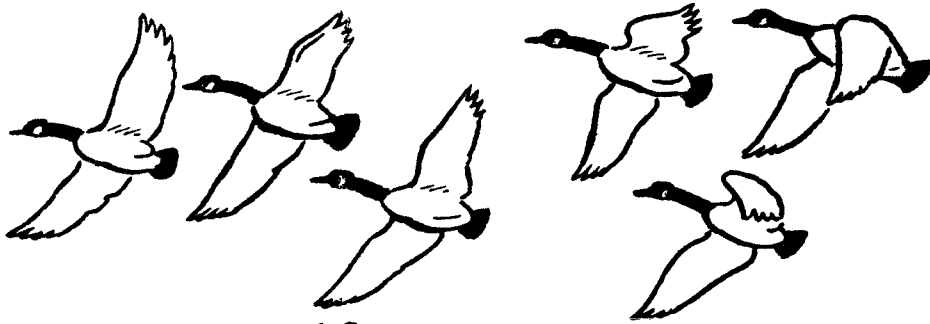

DUCK STAMPS ARE VERY COLORFUL AND MANY PEOPLE LIKE TO COLLECT THEM.
