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Service Outreach Reporting Requirements

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- 1. <u>Objective</u>. Define procedures to collect information to assess the effectiveness of NWS service outreach efforts.
- 2. Reporting Requirements. WFOs, CWSUs, and RFCs will report service outreach activities according to guidance from their regional headquarters. NCEP service centers will report outreach activities according to guidance from the NCEP Director. The regions and NCEP will submit an outreach report to OCWWS Awareness Branch by October 15 of each year. The report will reflect activities from the previous fiscal year and will contain the information outlined in appendix A.
