Scopes of Practice for Licensed Professional Counselors and Licensed Marriage and Family Therapists Under Oregon Statutes and Rules¹

According to existing Oregon statutes and rules, the lawful scopes of practice for Licensed Professional Counselors (LPCs) and Licensed Marriage and Family Therapists (LMFTs) includes "identification" and "diagnostic appraisal and assessment" of mental health conditions and problems.

As shown in the following table, these scopes of practice are determined by Chapter 675 of the Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) as interpreted by Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) Chapter 833, Division 10: ²
