1. Ms. Diane Rowland stated that pre-Katrina New Orleans had only two federally qualified health centers (FQHCs). Can FQHCs play a larger role in New Orleans? If so, what impediments do you see to the expansion of FQHCs at the federal, state, and local level?

The Honorable Gene Green

1. I am a strong proponent of health centers and understand the tremendous job they do to serve the uninsured. The cities of Houston and New Orleans both have high levels of uninsured with too few FQHCs to meet the need. So, I appreciate the challenges you face.

I understand that you have worked with Governor Blanco to craft a proposal for health center construction. Can you provide the committee with additional details on that proposal and explain how it will be utilized to leverage additional health care financing?

Additionally, with health centers saving three Medicaid dollars for every one federal dollar spent on them, there is no question that FQHCs are a good use of scarce health care dollars. As we look at rebuilding health care in New Orleans, can you elaborate on what role FQHCs will – or should – play in the reconstruction of the health care system?
