We write to congratulate you on your appointment as the Inspector General of the Department of Commerce and for your negotiation of corrective relief for two whistleblowers who cooperated with the Committee's investigation and were subjected to wrongful retaliation by former Inspector General Johnnie Frazier. With your appointment as the Inspector General, we expect that the Office of Inspector General (OIG) will now be able to appropriately carry out personnel actions such as these, especially those necessary to rectify past abuses of your predecessor, who was widely known to have abused the personnel system to favor select employees and punish those who disagreed with him.

In addition, we thank you for expediting the production of records to the Committee by ensuring delivery of certain long-awaited electronic records to Committee investigators (e-mail communication of Johnnie Frazier and other key individuals). We are concerned, however, that given the apparent lack of responsive material contained in the computer files received, all of the relevant data has not yet been produced to the Committee

Accordingly, we would ask that you ensure the delivery of a full, un-redacted set of those electronic records to the Committee, within <u>one week</u> of receipt of this letter, so our investigators have the original records of what was previously delivered to the Committee.

We appreciate your cooperation, and we look forward to working with you to restore the morale, efficiency, productiveness, and professionalism in the Office of Inspector General.
