## **Sod Sales Total \$25.2 Million**

Gross receipts from sod produced in Wisconsin totaled \$25.2 million in 2006. A recent survey conducted by the Wisconsin Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service found that sales receipts decreased 1 percent from the previous year. There were 200 fewer acres harvested for sod in 2006 than in 2005. Square feet of sod sold, at 190 million, was down 10 million from the previous year. Total acres in sod production, which includes recently seeded acres, declined 1 percent to 10,300 acres.

The sod industry employed a total of 240 people. Seasonal full-time employees accounted for 48 percent of the work force, while year-round full-time employees represented 27 percent of workers. The remaining 25 percent of workers was made up by part-time staff. Kentucky bluegrass was the main type of sod produced, with 95 percent of the total acreage. Blended grass mixtures containing Kentucky bluegrass accounted for 3 percent of the acres harvested. Other types, including salt-tolerant sod, creeping bentgrass, and supina bluegrass, made up 2 percent of the sales.

Survey results indicate that 76 percent of the sod was sold wholesale, consisting of sales to landscapers and other sod farms, or used in their own landscaping business. Sales at the retail level and directly to homeowners comprised 19 percent of the total sales. The rest of the sales were to highway and road departments, golf courses, and other venues, such as cemeteries and municipalities. About one-quarter of the sod producers reported sales in other states, and 50 percent of the sod harvested was shipped outside of Wisconsin.
