The Invasion of the Smoke Alarms - Door-to-Door Smoke Alarm Program

The Oregon Office of State Fire Marshal developed a model program to help local fire departments plan and conduct their own community door-to-door smoke alarm program. It includes recommendations for planning, recruiting community partners, implementing and evaluating your program.

Goals of the program:

- Install battery powered smoke alarms in homes without working smoke alarms which are high-risk for fire.
- Educate residents on the importance of maintaining their smoke alarms.

Workshops:

OSFM is offering *The Invasion of the Smoke Alarms* door-to-door campaign workshops at no cost for local fire departments and their community partners. Those attending the workshop will receive a free kit for the fire department. When the fire department's campaign agreement for a door-to-door campaign is approved they may receive up to 50 free smoke alarms and \$250 for the campaign.
