CALIFORNIA CROP PRODUCTION REPORT

Released: November 9, 2001

The latest survey, which was conducted during the last week of October and the first week of November, includes the following commodities:

Corn - Corn for grain production is expected to total 880,600 tons, down 21% from last year. Harvested acreage, at 185,000, is 21% below last year. The yield forecast is 4.76 tons per acre, unchanged from last year.

Cotton - The <u>Upland cotton</u> production forecast is 1.95 million bales as of November 1, up 3% from the October forecast, but down 12% from last year. This is based on 655,000 acres for harvest, with an average yield of 1,429 pounds per acre. The <u>American Pima</u> cotton production forecast is 560,000 bales, up 62% from last year. Harvested acreage is estimated to be 209,000, resulting in a yield of 1,286 pounds per acre.

Rice - All rice production in California for 2001 is forecast at 38.62 million cwt., down 11% from 2000. The yield forecast is 8,200 pounds per acre. Planted and harvested acreage remains at 475,000 and 471,000 acres, respectively.

Sugar Beets - The sugar beet production forecast is 1.61 million tons, down 47% from the 2000 crop. Acreage for harvest, at 43,500, is down 53%. The yield is forecast at 37.0 tons per acre, up 14% from 2000.

Production forecasts are released on a monthly basis and do not reflect final production estimates. Late summer and fall harvests may change these estimates considerably. The next production forecast will be issued December 11, 2001.
