

CALIFORIA EGG PRODUCTION


California's egg production during July totaled 437 million, an increase of 10.0 million from June's production and 30.0 million above July 2007. The average number of layers during the month totaled 19.8 million, 1 percent below last month, but 5 percent above June 2007. Eggs per 100 layers during the month were 2,210 compared to 2,131 a month earlier and 2,157 in July 2007.



U.S. JUNE MARCH EGG PRODUCTION

U.S. egg production totaled 7.60 billion during July 2008, up slightly from last year. Production included 6.49 billion table eggs, and 1.12 billion hatching eggs, of which 1.05 billion were broiler-type and 64 million were egg-type. The total number of layers during July 2008 averaged 336 million, down 1 percent from last year. July egg production per 100 layers was 2,262 eggs, up 1 percent from July 2007.

All layers in the U.S. on August 1, 2008 totaled 335 million, down 2 percent from last year. The 335 million layers consisted of 277 million layers producing table or market type eggs, 55.2 million layers producing broiler type hatching eggs, and 2.69 million layers producing egg-type hatching eggs. Rate of lay per day on August 1, 2008, averaged 72.5 eggs per 100 layers, up 1 percent from August 1, 2007.

U.S. BROILER HATCH

Broiler-type chicks hatched during July 2008 totaled 807 million, down 2 percent from July 2007. Eggs in incubators totaled 651 million on August 1, 2008, down 3 percent from a year earlier.

Leading breeders placed 7.07 million broiler-type pullet chicks for future domestic hatchery supply flocks during July 2008, up 6 percent from July 2007.

U.S. EGG-TYPE CHICKS HATCHED


Egg-type chicks hatched during July 2008 totaled 37.9 million, up 5 percent from July 2007. Eggs in incubators totaled 33.0 million on August 1, 2008, up 2 percent from a year ago.

Domestic placements of egg-type pullet chicks for future hatchery supply flocks by leading breeders totaled 244 thousand during July 2008, up 33 percent from July 2007.

U.S. TURKEY HATCHERY PRODUCTION

Turkey eggs in incubators on August 1, 2008, in the United States totaled 31.9 million, down 5 percent from August 1, 2007. Eggs in incubators were down 3 percent from the July 1, 2008 total of 32.8 million eggs. Regional changes from the previous year were: East North Central down 7 percent, West North Central down 4 percent, North and South Atlantic down 3 percent, and South Central and West down 8 percent.

Turkey poults hatched during July 2008, in the United States totaled 27.5 million, up 1 percent from July 2007. Poults hatched were up 5 percent from June 2008 total of 26.2 million poults. Regional changes from the previous year were: East North Central up slightly, West North Central down 3 percent, North and South Atlantic up 4 percent, and South Central and West up 3 percent.

The 26.8 million net poults placed during July 2008 in the United States were down 2 percent from the number placed during the same month a year earlier. Net placements were up 5 percent from the June 2008 total of 25.6 million.

U.S. TURKEYS RAISED

The preliminary estimate of turkeys raised in the United States during 2008 is 271 million, down slightly from the number raised during 2007.

The following six States are expected to account for about two-thirds of the turkeys produced in the United States during 2008: Minnesota, at 49.0 million turkeys, is up 2 percent from last year; North Carolina, at 39.0 million turkeys, is unchanged from last year; Arkansas, at 31.0 million turkeys, is unchanged from a year ago; Virginia, at 21.0 million turkeys, is unchanged from 2007; Missouri, at 20.0 million turkeys, is unchanged from last year; and Indiana, at 15.9 million turkeys, is up 5 percent from last year.

POULTRY AND EGG PRICES


California mid-month market egg price for July 2008 was 64.0 cents per dozen, 32.0 cents below the June mid-month price and down 20.0 cents from July 2007.

Nationally, the July market egg price, at 66.8 cents per dozen, decreased 25.9 cents from June and is 14.6 cents below July 2007. The July broiler price, at 50.0 cents per pound, is up 2.0 cents from June and 3.0 cents above a year ago. The July turkey price, at 60.7 cents per pound, is up 0.6 cent from the previous month and up 5.2 cents from a year earlier.
