- Once again, we have seen that there is no limit to the creativity and determination of our youth who understand what it means to take back their communities from the devastating effects of alcohol and underage drinking. **Community Briefings inspire...**creative projects and ideas among youth groups. In the months following the nation-wide Community Briefings this year, youth groups around the country have applied creative approaches to continue engaging their communities about alcohol issues and underage drinking.
- The increase in alcohol at the movies comes amid a decline in thicket sales in USA and Canada. **Bars, taverns and restaurants...** have long been prime outlets for on-premise alcohol service, but now the alcohol industry has discovered an untapped resource in the nation's movie theaters. Beer and wine is being offered, along with an expanding array of snack foods at movie theaters across the nation.
- About 42 percent of men and about 19 percent of women reported a history of either alcohol abuse or alcoholism during their lives. **The potential...** for ever-expanding

- alcohol problems has reached the point where nearly 1 in 3 Americans can look forward to becoming problem drinkers or alcoholics at some time in their life.
- Examining data regarding those who seek substance abuse treatment, the U.S. Census Bureau said that in 2006 there were 207,193 who checked in at an alcohol rehab facility and 394,294 who enrolled in rehab at a drug facility. Addictions, however along with other related problems tended not to be exclusively alcohol or other drug problem related. A total of 521,068 who sought addiction help suffered from problems with alcohol and other drugs as well. **Convenience Stores...** typically make their largest profits on alcohol sales, but now critics are wondering just how convenient purchasing beer, wine and liquor should be, as gas stations begin to add alcoholic beverages to the soda, milk and juice that have long filled their coolers. As the trend is developing, not all states require the same standards for mixing alcohol with gasoline.
