## **North Dakota Agricultural Prices**

The Index of Prices Received for All Farm Products in June is 232 percent of the 1990-1992 base, according to the USDA, National Agricultural Statistics Service, North Dakota Field Office. This is up 66 percent from last year and 111 percent above two years ago. The All Crops Index, at 266 percent of the base, is up 80 percent from June 2007 while the All Livestock and Products Index, at 111 percent, is down 1 percent from last year. June indexes are calculated using preliminary mid-month prices.

The May Index of Prices Received for All Farm Products, recalculated with full month prices, was 200 percent of the base, up 55 percent from May 2007. The All Crops Index, at 238 percent, was up 80 percent from the previous year while the All Livestock and Products Index, at 120 percent, was down 2 percent from May 2007.

Preliminary June prices, followed by the change from May:

Spring Wheat, \$10.10 per bushel, down 70 cents;

Durum Wheat, \$12.40 per bushel, down \$1.90;

Winter Wheat, \$8.50 per bushel, up 15 cents;

Oats, \$3.30 per bushel, up 3 cents;

Malting Barley, \$5.40 per bushel, up 11 cents;

Corn, \$5.80 per bushel, up 67 cents;

Soybeans, \$13.50 per bushel, up \$1.30;

Flaxseed, \$17.30 per bushel, up 50 cents:

All Sunflower, \$28.30 per cwt., up \$1.80;

All Dry Edible Beans, \$32.00 per cwt., up 90 cents;

All Potatoes, \$6.85 per cwt., down 5 cents;

Alfalfa Hay, \$75.00 per ton, up \$2.00;

Other Hay, \$54.00 per ton, up \$3.00;

Steers and Heifers, \$96.00 per cwt., down \$3.00;

Cows, \$54.00 per cwt., unchanged;

Calves, \$104.00 per cwt., down \$3.00.

May whole month prices, with no preliminary June, followed by the change from April:

Pinto Beans, \$29.90 per cwt., up 70 cents;

Navy Beans, \$34.90 per cwt., up 50 cents;

Oil Sunflower, \$27.00 per cwt., up \$3.30;

Non-oil Sunflower, \$25.00 per cwt., up 10 cents;

Fresh Potatoes, \$8.85 per cwt., down 75 cents:

Potatoes for Processing, \$6.30 per cwt., down 20 cents;

Hogs, \$52.00 per cwt., up \$7.10;

Lambs, \$110.00 per cwt., up \$15.00;

Sheep, \$26.00 per cwt., up \$1.00.

June prices are preliminary and based on sales data for only part of the month. They will be replaced with whole month prices in next month's report. May prices are based on sales data for the entire month.
