## **North Dakota Agricultural Prices**

The Index of Prices Received for All Farm Products in May is 191 percent of the 1990-1992 base, according to the USDA, National Agricultural Statistics Service, North Dakota Field Office. This is up 48 percent from last year and 72 percent above two years ago. The All Crops Index, at 224 percent of the base, is up 70 percent from May 2007 while the All Livestock and Products Index, at 121 percent, is down 2 percent from last year. May indexes are calculated using preliminary mid-month prices.

The April Index of Prices Received for All Farm Products, recalculated with full month prices, was 211 percent of the base, up 61 percent from April 2007. The All Crops Index, at 245 percent, was up 84 percent from the previous year while the All Livestock and Products Index, at 118 percent, was down 6 percent from April 2007.

Spring Wheat, \$10.00 per bushel, down \$1.90;

Durum Wheat, \$12.00 per bushel, down 70 cents;

Winter Wheat, \$7.55 per bushel, down \$1.49;

Oats, \$3.10 per bushel, up 13 cents;

Feed Barley, \$3.68 per bushel, unchanged;

Malting Barley, \$4.80 per bushel, up 13 cents;

Corn, \$5.00 per bushel, up 16 cents;

Soybeans, \$12.10 per bushel, up 30 cents;

Flaxseed, \$16.60 per bushel, down 70 cents;

All Sunflower, \$26.00 per cwt., up \$1.90;

Canola, \$24.00 per cwt., down 90 cents;

All Dry Edible Beans, \$30.40 per cwt., up 20 cents;

All Potatoes, \$7.30 per cwt., down 50 cents;

Alfalfa Hay, \$73.00 per ton, up \$3.00;

Other Hay, \$51.00 per ton, up \$1.00;

Steers and Heifers, \$98.00 per cwt., up \$3.00;

Cows, \$53.00 per cwt., up \$2.00;

Calves, \$108.00 per cwt., up \$2.00.

April whole month prices, with no preliminary May, followed by the change from March:

Pinto Beans, \$29.20 per cwt., down 40 cents;

Oil Sunflower, \$23.70 per cwt., down \$2.70;

Non-oil Sunflower, \$24.90 per cwt., up \$2.30;

Fresh Potatoes, \$9.60 per cwt., down 90 cents;

Potatoes for Processing, \$6.50 per cwt., down 10 cents;

Hogs, \$44.90 per cwt., up \$2.70;

Lambs, \$95.00 per cwt., unchanged;

Sheep, \$25.00 per cwt., down \$3.00.

May prices are preliminary and based on sales data for only part of the month. They will be replaced with whole month prices in next month's report. April prices are based on sales data for the entire month.
