North Dakota Agricultural Prices

The Index of Prices Received for All Farm Products in October is 186 percent of the 1990-1992 base, according to the USDA, National Agricultural Statistics Service, North Dakota Field Office. This is up 46 percent from last year and 54 percent above two years ago. The All Crops Index, at 202 percent of the base, is up 58 percent from October 2006 and the All Livestock and Products Index, at 124 percent, is up one percent from last year. October indexes are calculated using preliminary mid-month prices.

The September Index of Prices Received for All Farm Products, recalculated with full month prices, was 183 percent of the base, up 42 percent from September 2006. The All Crops Index, at 197 percent, was up 52 percent from the previous year while the All Livestock and Products Index, at 124 percent, was unchanged from September 2006.

Oats, \$2.25 per bushel, down 5 cents;

Corn, \$3.10 per bushel, down 9 cents;

Soybeans, \$8.25 per bushel, up 42 cents;

Flaxseed, \$11.50 per bushel, up \$1.94;

Oil Sunflower, \$17.80 per hundredweight (cwt.), up 40 cents;

Non-Oil Sunflower, \$18.00 per cwt., unchanged;

Canola, \$17.40 per cwt., up \$2.40:

All Dry Edible Beans, \$24.50 per cwt., up \$2.80;

Alfalfa Hay, \$60.00 per ton, up \$2.00;

Other Hay, \$42.00 per ton, up \$2.00;

Steers and Heifers, \$109.00 per cwt., up \$2.00;

Cows, \$45.00 per cwt., down \$2.00;

Calves, \$120.00 per cwt., down \$3.00.

September whole month prices, with no preliminary October, followed by the change from August:

Pinto Beans, \$21.80 per cwt., down 70 cents;

Hogs, \$47.70 per cwt., down \$4.50;

Lambs, \$103.00 per cwt., up \$1.00;

Sheep, \$27.00 per cwt., down \$3.00.

October prices are preliminary and based on sales data for only part of the month. They will be replaced with whole month prices in next month's report. September prices are based on sales data for the entire month.
