RECOMMENDED ORDER APPROVING WITHDRAWAL OF OBJECTIONS AND DISMISSING CLAIM

This matter arises under the Surface Transportation Assistance Act ("the STAA"). 49 U.S.C. § 31105. The trial in this matter is scheduled for September 6, and 7, 2007 in Sacramento, California.

On August 16, 2007, Respondent's counsel filed signed copies Complainant's Notice of Withdrawal of Objections to the Secretary's Findings and Request for Dismissal.

Under the STAA regulations, at any time before the findings and order become final, a party may withdraw his objections to the findings or order by filing a written withdrawal with the administrative law judge. 29 C.F.R. § 1978.111(c). The judge shall determine whether to approve the withdrawal.

Given that Complainant's request to withdraw his objections to the Secretary's findings and for dismissal of his case appears voluntary, and that Respondent does not object, Complainant's request to withdraw his objections and for dismissal of his case is hereby APPROVED. Accordingly, the Secretary's findings are REINSTATED, and this matter is hereby DISMISSED with prejudice.

The hearing scheduled to commence on September 6, 2007 in Sacramento, California is CANCELLED.
