¹ Although the complaint initially referenced the employee protection provisions of several environmental statutes which require approval of any settlement agreement by the Secretary of Labor, the investigative findings of the OSHA Area Director determined that the Respondent is not a covered employer within the meaning of these other statues, and the parties have stipulated that the complaint and their settlement arise solely under the FWPCA which does not require such approval. *See Dorsey v. Greenbriar County Public Service District #2*, USDOL/OALJ Reporter (HTML), ARB Case No. 97-128, OALJ No. 1996-WPC-3 (ARB Sept. 29, 1997).
