The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Albuquerque District has Interagency Agreements with the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA), Office of Facilities Management and Construction (OFMC). The OFMC provides infrastructure support to the BIA schools. The OFMC's program is responsible for facilities in 26 states. Albuquerque District services under this agreement include design, construction and construction management.

The initial agreement (June 99) with the BIA was for school upgrades at different locations in New Mexico and Arizona. Subsequent agreements have been for design and construction of new schools and dormitory facilities. Current projects under construction include Leupp, and Winslow, AZ with projects at Kayenta, AZ and San Felipe, NM to be awarded for construction prior to end of May 2007.

The first new school facility, in Prewitt, New Mexico was dedicated in August, 2003 and was the first Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Certified facility in NM. In addition to several other school upgrade projects, the Albuquerque District is currently providing planning, and design services for the following locations: Wingate, Crowne Point Ojo Encino, NM; Wide Ruins, and Hunters Point AZ. The Albuquerque District is also providing design and construction services for fire protection system upgrades at various locations in NM, AZ, and SD.
